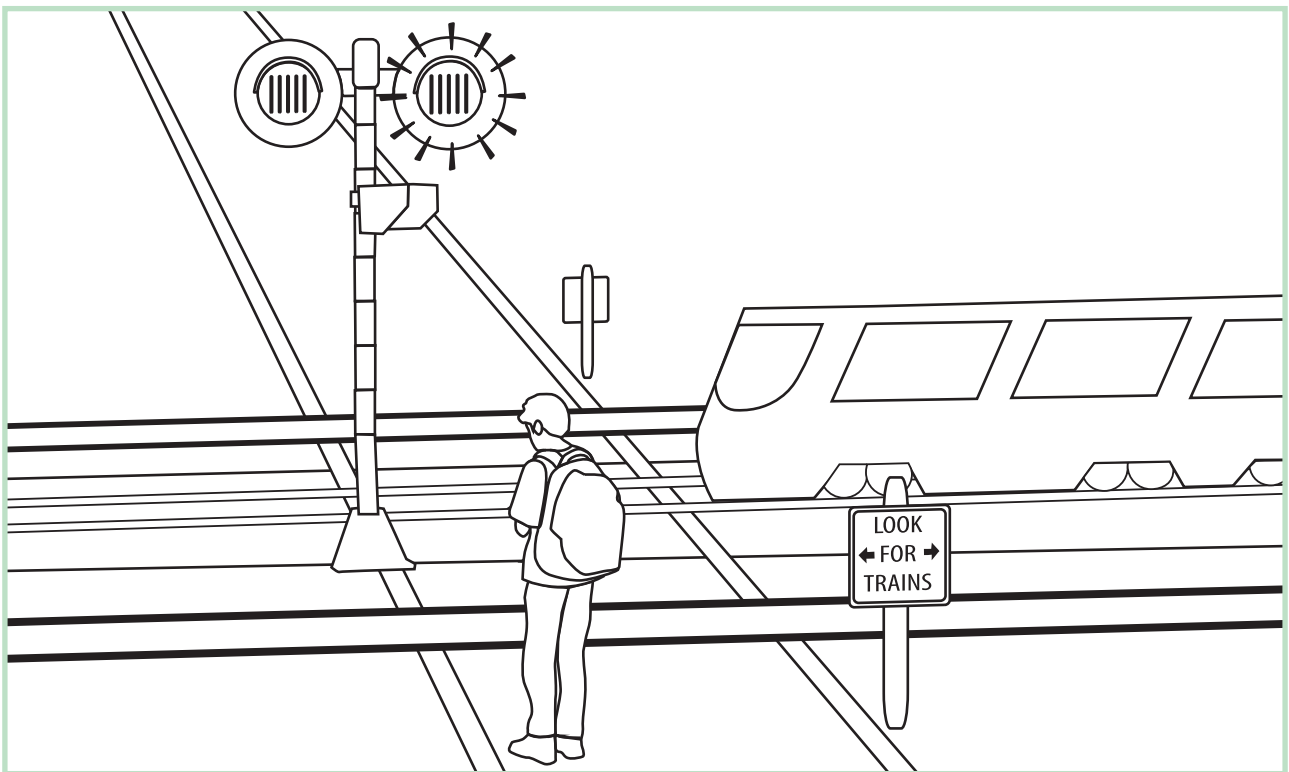


# Safety around trains and buses

2. Circle YES or NO to answer the safety questions.



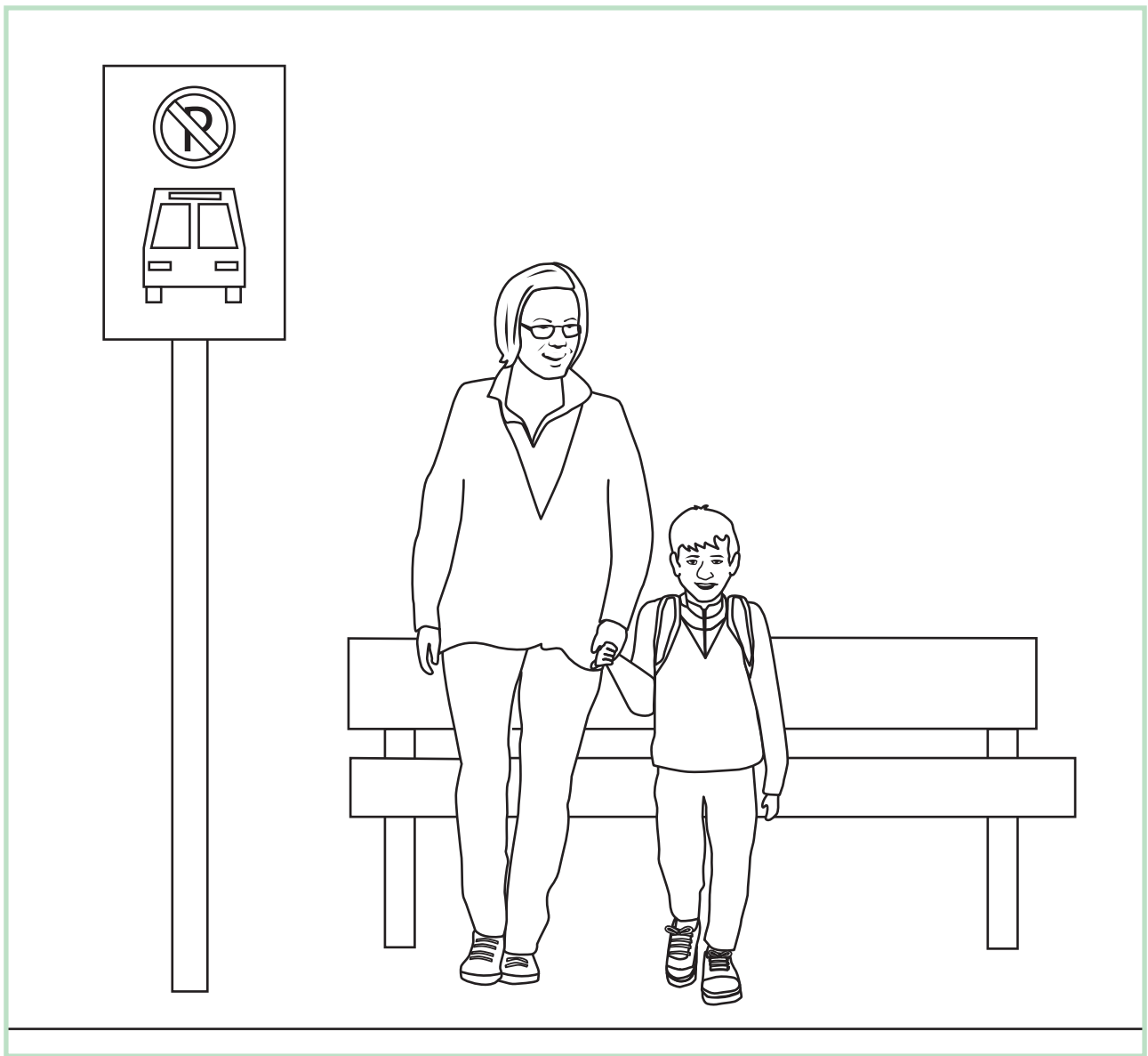
Always stay behind the safety line when near railway tracks.

Colour in the rest of the picture.



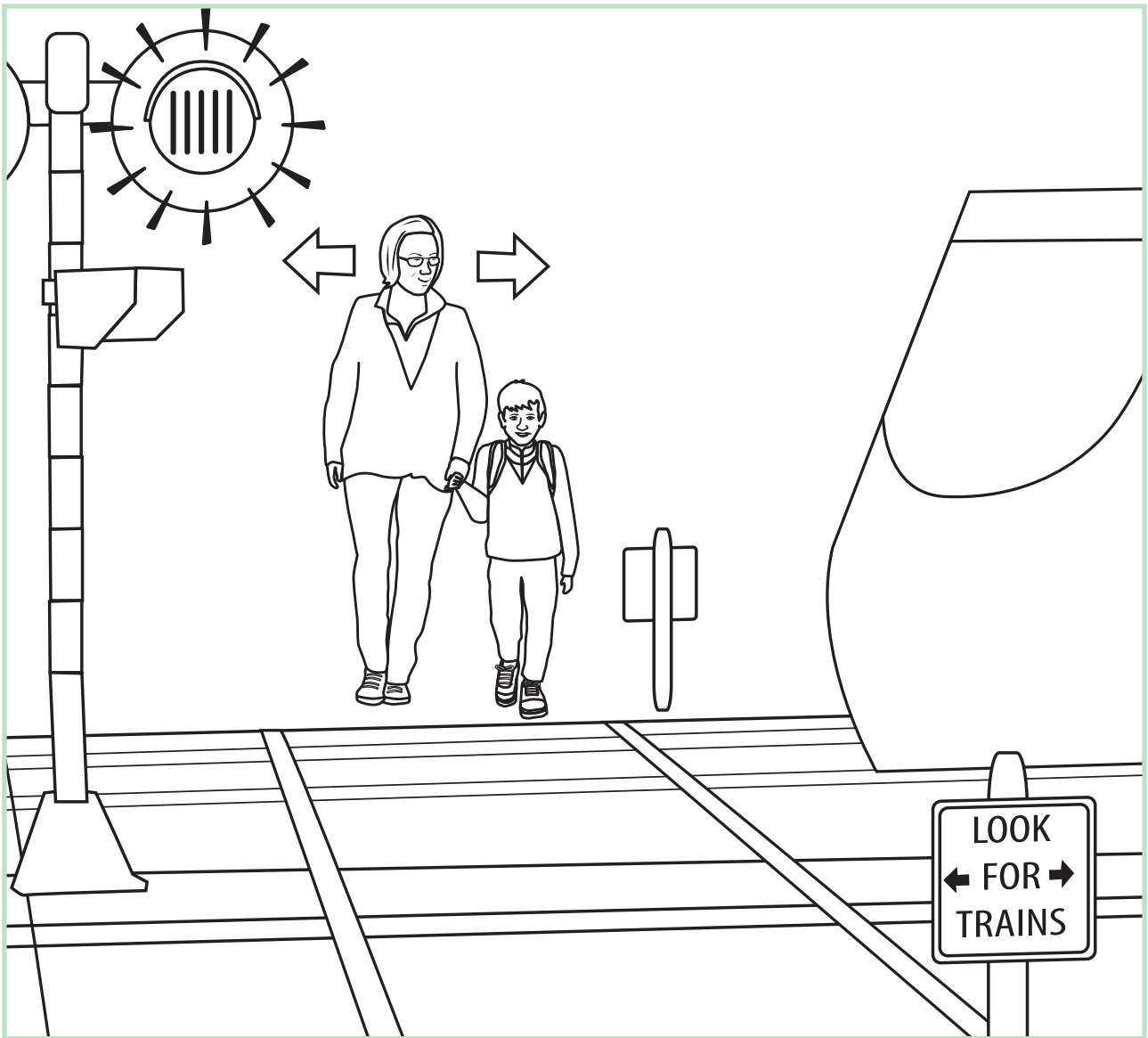
Hold an adult's hand when crossing railway tracks or waiting at a bus stop.

Colour in the rest of the picture.



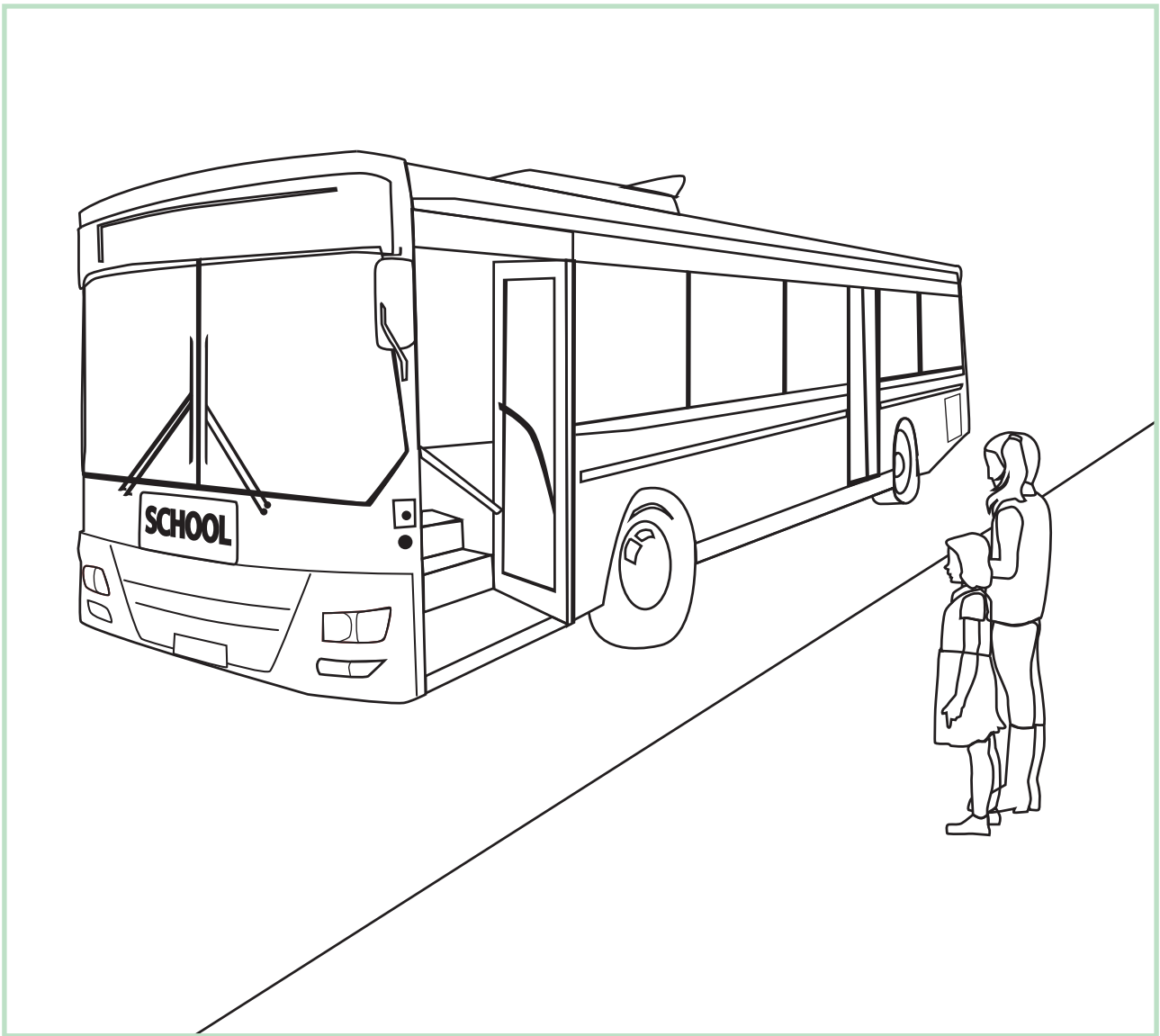
Look both ways for trains before crossing railway tracks.

Colour in the rest of the picture.



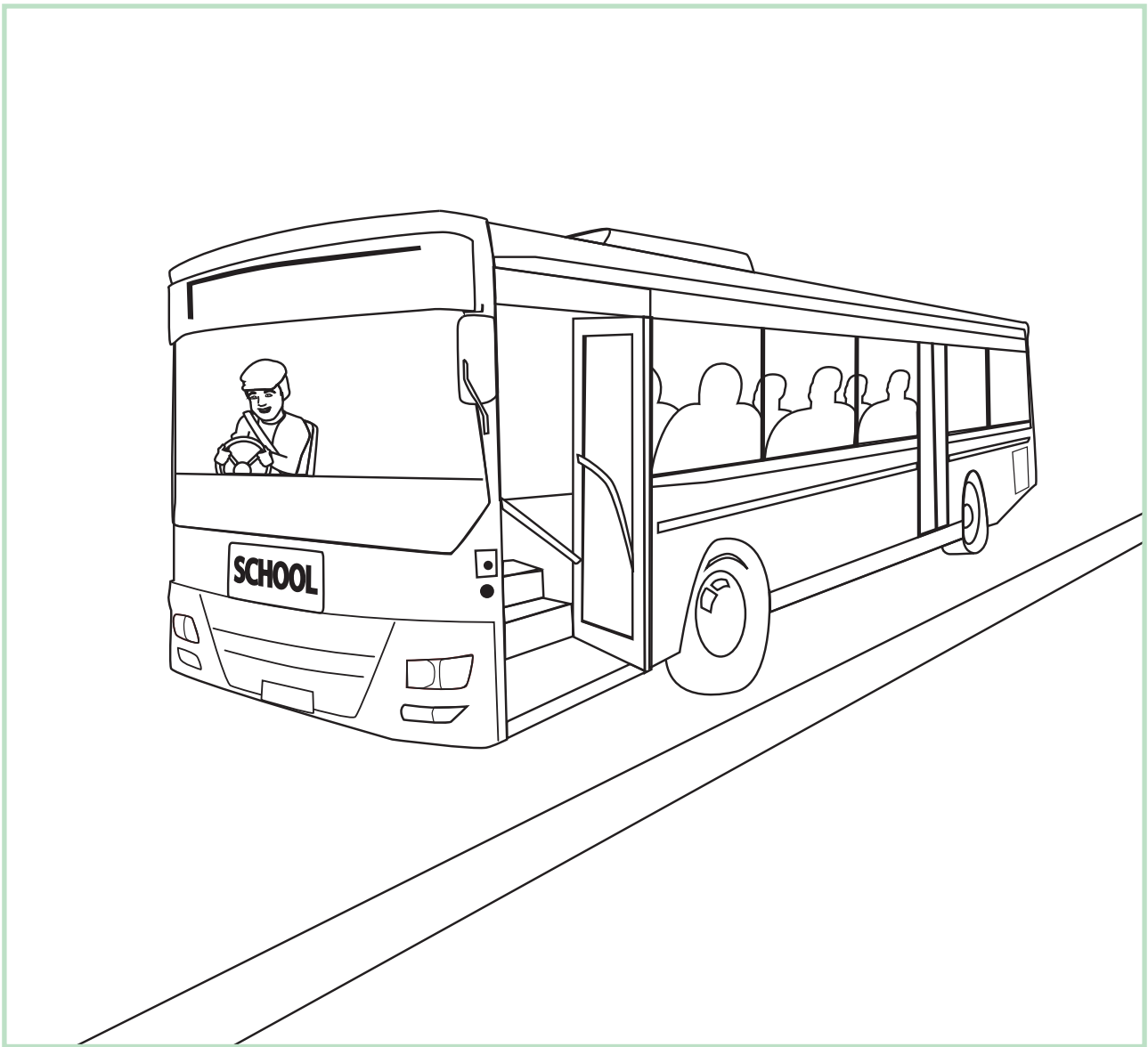
Wait for the bus or train to come to a complete stop before getting on or off.
