Draw a picture of yourself doing a safety practice you want to teach others about.

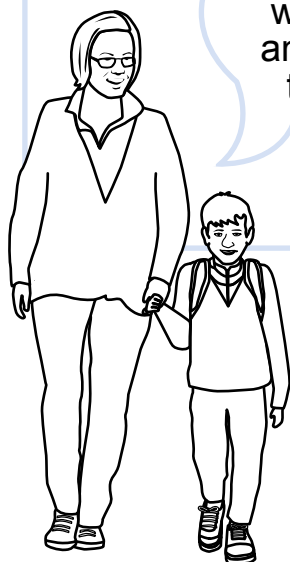
Example: looking both ways before crossing the road.

travel safety?




3. Writing dialogue

Imagine you're talking to a friend or family member about the safety practice in your drawing. Write a play in which you explain why the safety practice is important and how your friend or family member can stay safe.

Example: Child: "Kia ora e Hine! Do you know how to cross the road safely?" Friend: "Um, I think so. Just look right and left, right?" Child: "Yes, but it's important to look both ways, just like my drawing. That way, we make sure no cars are coming from either direction before crossing."
